

Taco Salad Table Topper Supply List

Fabrics:

Background-- 1 fat quarter (18 x 22)

Assorted Prints: 3 fat quarters (18 x 22) (includes binding and backing)

Batting 20" x 20"

Pattern book *Let's Do Lunch* Book is available at RSC

Rotary cutter, cutting mat and ruler

Neutral thread for piecing; matching thread for quilting

Pins, scissors, ripper, safety pins for quilting

This is a fun project that you can probably finish in one class session.

If you have time it would be helpful if you can pick your fabrics ahead of time. Have your fabrics pressed and ready to cut when you get to class.

SERGER JACKET Supply List

This is a fun class, and a very easy project. You will need basic serger skills which include threading (we only do it once here), stitching around curves and straight seams. If you need help with changing threads, we can do that.

Bring: 4-thread serger
Power cord
Foot control
Tweezers
Scissors, tape measure and pins
4 serger threads to co-ordinate with fabric

Fabric: The sample at the store is done with batiks, which are nice because they look the same on both sides of the fabric, but any fabric is fine. Even a jacket weight fabric will work for this if you want. There is no "pattern" for the jacket, just measurements, and the fabric does need to tear.
--2 ½ yards (based on 45" fabric) for body of jacket
--½ yard for the band and cuffs
**you will decide in class how long to make the jacket, and how long to make your sleeves, so the fabric listed here may be a bit too much but it's better to have extra just in case



Pockets All Around Tote Bag

SUPPLIES:

2 fat qtrs (different fabrics) - Bag Body - Fabrics A & B
Or ½ yd Bag Body

2 fat qtrs (different fabrics) - Pockets - Fabrics C & D

1 - 3" wof strip of fabric - Handles (duplicate one of your fat qtrs or select a coordinating fabric)

1 yd - Lining and Inside Pockets

1 ½ yds fusible fleece or fusible pellow

6 large buttons

Magnetic clasps or Velcro (optional - used to make purse closure)

Cutting mat, rotary cutter, suggest ¼" foot (not required), measuring tape or small ruler, marking pencil, usual sewing supplies

Judy's Cool Shirt – Supply List

What you will need to bring to class:

- Pattern
- Fabric
- Sewing machine with electrical cords, foot pedal, and extension cord
- Standard feet for your machine
- Rotary cutter with straight blade
- Rotary cutter with pinking bladed (optional)
- 6" x 24" Ruler
- Interfacing (fusible or sew-in)
- Thread to match fabric
- Bobbins already wound with thread to match fabric
- Machine needles (bring extra in case one breaks)
- Hand sewing needles
- Fine point fabric scissors, paper scissors, thread snips, seam ripper
- Good quality straight pins (silk pins are best)
- Pencil – regular lead
- Tissue paper or newsprint paper
- Fusible Tricot
- Small bag for trash
- Most importantly...YOU....ready to have a fun and creative time!
